RESTRICTED ACTIVITY AUTHORIZATION REGULATION

Definitions

1 In this Regulation,

- (a) repealed AR 77/2009 s2;
- (b) “psychosocial intervention” means the restricted activity of performing a psychosocial intervention with an expectation of treating a substantial disorder of thought, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs
 - (i) judgment,
 - (ii) behaviour,
 - (iii) capacity to recognize reality, or
 - (iv) ability to meet the ordinary demands of life;
- (b.1) “regional health authority” means a regional health authority under the *Regional Health Authorities Act*;
- (c) “service provider” means a person, other than a regulated member, whose name appears on a list of service providers maintained by a regional health authority for the purposes of this Regulation and who
 - (i) is an employee or agent of a regional health authority and provides or supervises addictions counselling,
 - (ii) is not an employee or agent of a regional health authority but provides addictions counselling pursuant to a contract with a regional health authority, or
 - (iii) is not an employee or agent of a regional health authority but provides addictions counselling when conducting a program for the prevention or treatment of alcohol and drug abuse and receives financial assistance from a regional health authority for the program.

Authorization

2 A service provider may perform a psychosocial intervention but only for the purpose of providing addictions counselling in respect of alcohol, drugs, gambling or tobacco.
